From The Heart

Greetings, Dear Friends!

How many “famous” people have you met? Now you can fill in your own interpretation of what the word “famous” means to you. Have you perhaps met a past or current President of the United States or other political figure? Have you met a “movie star?” Have you met any people you see on TV on a regular basis? Any famous singers or musicians?

I’ve met a few people that some would term “famous” over the years. The funny thing is most of the time when I’ve met them, they look different than what I thought they would be. One actor was about 4 inches shorter in person than I thought he was. One famous author felt more superficial in person than I thought he would be. One famous singer was way more personal and down to earth than I thought he would be. I loved how real, vulnerable, and normal he seemed.

Sometimes your impression of someone changes when you meet them in person. It can be better; it can be worse.

I’m thinking about this now as I think about a person who is grieving. One has a picture of God in one’s mind before their loved one dies. Now, after death, that picture of God may look different. God may feel more distant and uncaring. God may not have been in the picture and now there is some questioning about faith

matters. God may appear more real and personal than ever before. Seeing a famous person in real life can change one’s perspective of that person. *So also, after a death, one can experience a new perspective on God. It can feel better; it can feel worse.*

Many people have this important topic of **faith** as a foundational base. When death occurs, what has perhaps been strong and unwavering, can now feel messy at best. It looks different for each person. We are going to have some honest discussion of whether your previous picture of God is matching what you are currently experiencing with God. You are now seeing things up close from a new grieving perspective. Has anything changed for you? It’s harder to find someone more “famous” than God. What does God look like for you now? We will dig into the topic of **faith**.
